

## 2018 Ellice T. Johnston Scholarship for the Ceramic Arts AWARD

Upon careful review and consideration, the Scholarship Committee has awarded the 2018 Ellice T. Johnston Scholarship for the Ceramic Arts to Mr. Kyle Demmon, a ceramic student at the California College of the Arts.

Originally from Cottage Grove, Oregon "Kye" impressed the committee with his interest in the relationships between nature and people. He created a project of thrown pots stamped with "The Bee's Needs" and seeds, then left them around the community for people to find. He made hand built "pest planters" of local raccoons, opossums, skunks to generate discussion around coexisting with animals. He was given strong recommendations from CCA professors regarding his work ethic, commitment to technology and craft, and kind nature.

We congratulate Kye Demmon and hope this scholarship will allow him to continue in ceramics education while honoring the memory of Ellice T. Johnston and her kind ways.

## Tea Duong WORKSHOP RECAP

Clayfolk sponsored a workshop with Junction City potter, Tea Duong on the weekend of May 19+20. Tea lectured and demo-ed techniques both mornings. Demos included throwing very volumetric traditional Hungarian folk pottery forms, large platters, and Tea's unique and beautiful way of texturing surfaces on the wheel. In the afternoons, participants had the opportunity to try out these methods. The workshop was held in the spacious ceramics classroom at South Medford High School, thanks to Clayfolk member Russ Richmond who teaches ceramics there. This was the first time using this venue for a Clayfolk event and it worked out very well. There were half as many wheels as workshop participants which encouraged interaction as people had the opportunity to watch what others were doing, talk to Tea and about the techniques, and coach each other while their partner was using the wheel. It was noted that if we use the South Medford High School ceramics facility in the future, we should provide clay for the workshop that is compatible with the school's firing temp, so the students can pug/use our leftovers.

#### **Oregon's First Community Created Mosaic Mural**

Karen Rycheck is in the process of facilitating Talent, Oregon's first community created mosaic mural. The subject/title is "Talent, OR: Bee City USA, and will be a somewhat abstracted pollinator garden scene.

It will be installed in the late summer/early fall on the base of the 32'L x 19"H City Hall Stage across from the Talent Library and Commons.

All of the flowers will be made by community members (ages 8 to 107) during workshops given by Karen throughout the spring and summer. Cost to participate will be \$15 plus a small surcharge. This fee helps offset costs of materials, installation, and permitting fees as well as adding funds to help Talent Maker City's programs expand.

These elements in ceramic (little kids) and glass (older kids/adults) will be set on fiberglass mesh squares during indoor/outdoor workshops.

Around July 15th I will take all of these flowers and lay them out to create the design. I'll incorporate appropriate foliage, add some butterflies, bees, and the lettering myself, or with the help of other mosaic artists.




